

SOCIAL SKILLS RESOURCE LIST

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- 1. Room 14: A Social Language Program**-LinguiSystems-has social skills checklist for the teacher or parent to complete, letting you know what to target in therapy, under these topics: Making and Keeping Friends; Fitting In At School; Handling Your Feelings; Using Self-Control; & Being Responsible. Program includes the Instructor's Manual, Activity Book (worksheets), and Picture Book-with stories & questions.
- 2. Fold and Say Social Skills stories**-Super Duper: You copy, fold, read, and discuss little social skills stories, such as "It Was An Accident", "Asking For Directions", "It Wasn't Me", etc. Includes page for child to illustrate or write what will happen next and discussion questions. Can send home with child for home discussion.
- 3. Maxwell's Manor: A Social Language Game**-LinguiSystems: fun game for ages 4-9; has stimulus cards/ questions for Nonverbal Communication, Conversation Skills, Being a Friend, Self-Control, Being Polite, and Following the Rules.
- 4. Practicing Pragmatics Fun Deck**-Super Duper: Contains questions like "There's one piece of pizza left. Both you and your friend want it. What will you do?" or "Someone new moves in next door to you. What do you say?"
- 5. CLIP (Clinical Language Intervention Program): Pragmatics Worksheets**-Psychological Corporation: Worksheets to use for therapy or social skills home practice. These areas: Greetings and Good-byes; Calls for Attention; Asking for Permission; Asking for Information; Asking for More Information; Requesting Repetition; Commenting; Expressing Approval; Expressing Disapproval; Direct Request for Action; Indirect Requests; & Protesting.
- 6. Letter Talk A to Z: The ABC's of Communication**-Super Duper: 26 posters with pragmatics/social skills activities on the back; also comes with reproducible activity booklet-with the same activities that are on the back of the posters.
- 7. Social Star: I have Book 1: General Interaction Skills**-Thinking Publications-includes Cognitive Planning (Stop, Plot, Go, So); Eye Contact; Volume; Tone of Voice; Facial Expression; Posture; Personal Space; Hygiene; Body Talk; Manners; Listening Basics; Staying on Topic/ Switching Topics; Conversations; Interrupting; Right Time & Place; & Being Formal or Casual.
- 8. Social Skills Stories: Functional Picture Stories for Readers and Nonreaders K-12-**Mayer-Johnson Co.: has Mayer Johnson pictures for use with children with severe communication problems (e.g. autism) or nonreaders; includes Gary Greets (can change to your child's name); Tony Topics; Interrupting Isaac; Connie Comments; Vinnie Says "Excuse Me!"; Tad Too Close; Jose Buys a Present; & Tami Says "Excuse Me".
- 9. One of the HELP books** has a section on Social Language.
